It's a FREE service so there's no need to take a chance. You can reach JULIE by calling 811 or 1-800-892-0123 or by going online at www.illinois1call.com and enter your own locate request. Common examples of projects that require contacting JULIE include putting up a fence; installing a swing set; a mail box post; or water feature such as a pool, pond or fountain; building a deck; preparing a new garden or landscape area; or planting trees, bushes or shrubs. Be sure to make your locate request at least 2 working days before digging.

Do You Have A Golf Cart?

Summer is here and with the warm weather we will see an increase in the use of golf carts on the village streets. Here are a few things to remember when operating your golf cart in the Village of Deer Creek:



*Register the golf cart prior to operation of the vehicle on Village streets. Proof of liability insurance should be presented when the vehicle is registered with the Deer Creek Police Department.

*Golf carts may not be operated on any street designated a truck route but may cross a truck route and may not travel a speed in excess of 25 miles per hour. Operators driving the golf cart under the influence of alcohol may result in being prosecuted for driving while under the influence of alcohol as provided by Illinois law.

*Golf cart operator must possess a valid driver's license.

*Any golf carts that are operated on the Village streets must, at a minimum, have the following: brakes, a steering apparatus, tires, a rearview mirror, red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear, a slow moving vehicle emblem on the rear of the golf cart, a headlight that emits a white light visible from at least 100 feet from the rear, brake lights, and turn signals.

*If you need to register your golf cart you may do so at the Deer Creek Police Department, 106 E. First Ave, Deer Creek, or for further questions please call 309-447-6265.
